

# JEFFREYS BAY PRIMARY

## POLICY: GENERAL APPEARANCE AND BEHAVIOUR

### Clothes – School uniform

#### **Girls: Summer uniform**

Navy blue school dress (sleeveless tunic) with school badge

White open necked short-sleeved shirt (with school badge)

Short white socks and black school shoes

#### **Girls: Winter school uniform**

Navy blue school dress (sleeveless tunic) with school badge

White long-sleeved shirt with collar that is fully buttoned OR Navy school tracksuit top with school badge (Must have a working zip)

School tie

Navy blue long-sleeved school jersey with school badge

Navy blue tights

Black school shoes

#### **Boys: Summer uniform**

White short-sleeved shirt with school badge.

Grey school shorts

Grey school socks with light blue stripes where they fold under the knee. (Socks MUST be pulled up.)

Navy sleeveless pullover with school badge.

Black school shoes

#### **Boys: Winter uniform**

Grey school trousers

White long-sleeved shirt (buttoned to collar) under school tracksuit top or school jersey (long-sleeved) with school badge OR sleeveless navy pullover with school badge over white short-sleeved shirt.

School tie

Black school shoes

## **General appearance while wearing school uniform.**

### **Girls:**

Hair accessories must be white or navy blue.

Nails must be short and clean. No painted or coloured nails.

Only one pair of small gold studs or sleepers in earlobe.

No bands, bracelets or strings around wrists. Only "Medic Alert" bracelets are allowed.

A watch may be worn.

However; learners may NOT wear smart watches or bring them to school.

No coloured hair. No highlights. No gel, mousse or Vaseline may be used to style hair. Long fringes must be clipped back.

If hair pieces (braids) are worn they must be in good taste and not too long or heavy. Braids must be tied in a pony-tail.

No tattoos. Learners may not write or draw on their bodies.

### **Boys:**

No gel, mousse or Vaseline may be used to style hair.

Hair must be neat and short and may not touch the collar or ears.

No long fringes.

Hair may not be shaved in patterns. No steps or geometric cuts /styles may be worn. No "smart" cuts or braids.

Boys may not wear jewellery.

A watch may be worn.

However; learners may NOT wear smart watches or bring them to school.

No coloured hair.

No bands, bracelets or strings around wrists. Only "Medic Alert" bracelets are allowed.

No tattoos. Learners may not write or draw on their bodies.

### **"Civvies"**

Learners may wear "civvies" or casual clothes on their birthdays and on casual days. Casual clothes must be neat. Shoes or flip flops may be worn.

No extravagant or provocative clothing may be worn. Body must be decently covered.

**Girls:** Pants and shorts may not be too tight. Dresses and skirts must cover the body properly and may not be too short. Underwear may not show. Girls' tummies, back and/or breasts may not show.

-No painted or coloured nails, even when wearing casual clothes.

-No coloured or highlighted hair. No gel, mousse or Vaseline may be used to style hair. Long fringes must be clipped back.

-If hair pieces (braids) are worn they must be in good taste and not too long or heavy. Braids must be tied in a pony-tail.

- Long hair must be tied even when casual clothes are worn.
- Only one pair of small gold studs or sleepers in earlobe.
- Girls may wear a chain or beads around the neck on Civvies days.
- No bands or strings around the wrists.
- A watch may be worn.

However, learners may NOT wear smart watches or bring them to school.

- No tattoos. Learners may not write or draw on their bodies.

**Boys:** Shirts must cover the torso. Sleeveless shirts must be chosen with care as the tummy and ribcage may not be shown.

-Boys may not wear jewellery.

-A watch may be worn.

-However; learners may not wear smart watches or bring them to school.

-No bands, bracelets or strings around wrists. Only “Medic Alert” bracelets are allowed.

-No tattoos. Learners may not write or draw on their bodies.

## **Behaviour**

Learners must protect the proud name and image of the school. When learners are outside the school grounds and especially when they are dressed in school uniform, their behaviour must be excellent and worthy of the school.

No crude language or swearing.

No uncouth or bad behaviour.

Honesty, humility, politeness and helpfulness at all times.

Learners may not chew chewing gum when they are at school or when they visit other schools or public places for sport or culture.

Learners are expected to show respect to one another, staff, learners, staff and learners of other schools, parents and adults.

Learners may not damage classrooms, desks, chairs, books or any other school property. Learners are responsible for keeping their classrooms and their learning and teaching areas neat and clean.

Classroom- and playground rules must be adhered to.

The school will not tolerate any incidents of physical, physiological or cyber bullying. If learners are found guilty of any form of bullying, disciplinary steps will be followed.
